PPI in Research Design



- Shape the study design
- Clarify the research question and relevancy
- Appropriate methods (incl. intervention)
- Recruitment strategy
- Appropriate outcomes and data collection
- Lay summary
- On-going PPI
- Co-applicants



RDS WM Support for PPI



- PPI integral to advice and support provided
- Individual support to ensure that researchers adopt good PPI practice that is relevant and aligned with the expectations of funding bodies.
- Information and resources
- Observation of and support for PPI activities
- Review of lay summary and 'PPI sections' of grant proposals



PPI Bursary



- Supports PPI during the design phase:
 - Up to £500 per project
 - Swift decision
 - Pay for PPI activities (payment, travel expenses, venue hire, refreshments)



PPI Bursary



- Since April, RDS WM has received
 - 12 bursary requests,
 - o of which 10 were awarded
 - o totalling £3,567.



PPI in the RDS WM

Regional Collaboration



- Represented at PILAR (Public Involvement and Lay Accountability in Research) forum
 - o PPI leaders from regional NIHR organisations (Research Design Service, Clinical Research Network, CLAHRC), Academic Health Science Network and key research centres
 - to provide strategic direction for PPI and knowledge sharing in the West Midlands.
