Law

Keele Law graduates are able to think, talk and write critically about the law in a systematic way, drawing on the traditions and methods of both legal doctrinal analysis and the social sciences. They communicate ideas and information effectively. They can evaluate and apply theories about the nature of law and legal practice. Graduates will have experience of solving practical legal problems by examining cases, investigating the legal issues arising and offering accurate and well-researched answers. Keele graduates are flexible and adaptive. Through their core and co-curricular education, they have developed a social awareness and an understanding of the international and practical context of the markets in which law operates. They will be able to research a project in law, conducting the necessary enquiries independently and writing up their findings in accordance with scholarly conventions.
